Squeaky ... he is more than a squirrel




Chancing upon a seemingly common squirrel, the Bickering Brothers are thrust into the most incredible adventures of their lives.


Visiting the Kingdom of Glow Worms, readers and the boys alike learn that "glow worms" are misnomers.






Magical Oak Tree




But Squeaky may not even have that choice as a dramatically shocking turn in their adventures forces his hand and the camaraderie that had been built up over the years is brutally torn apart!

Squeakyis Dilemma




